Second Sunday of Advent Sunday, December 10th, 2023

The Second Week of Advent is the week of Peace and when we light the candle of peace. This is a time of coming together, of building a community of faith that is open to all. This is why we see Christmas movies telling a story of restoration, of broken relationships that are healed.

"For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us;

And the government will rest on His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace" Isaiah 9:6



This verse tells us that Jesus came to be the Prince of Peace. The word peace is the Hebrew word shalom which means completeness or well being. Jesus did not come just to end wars, but to make us complete by saving us from our sinfulness. On this the Second Sunday of Advent, we are invited to reflect upon the role of John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus and the salvation that he would bring to us.

Did You Know? A QUAD can help!

People who are 70 1/2 or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA (other than ongoing SEP or SIMPLE IRA) directly to a charity and save from paying income taxes on the distribution. This is known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) or an IRA Charitable Rollover and it counts toward your minimum Distribution (RMD). If you are taking the IRS Standard deduction, this may provide a tax break for some or all of your contribution to the church.


